



On behalf of the Rotary International District 3060 Youth Exchange Programme, we are inviting applications for youth exchange students for the following programmes.

- 1. Long-term Youth Exchange (11 months),
- 2. Short-term Youth Exchange (3-6 weeks) and
- 3. New Generations Service Exchange (3-6 weeks).

The probable countries with whom we generally exchange for long term programme are Germany, France, USA, Brazil, Mexico, Columbia, Italy, Netherlands, Japan etc.

For Short term programme we generally exchange with France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Brazil, Argentina, Spain, South Africa and Czech Republic etc.

For NGSE programme we generally exchange with Germany, Spain, Italy, France, Africa, Argentina, Brazil and USA etc.

IMPORTANT CRITERIA:

As per the rules of District 3060 and the guidelines given by Rotary International, the important criteria for selection are mentioned below. Each club willing to sponsor a student must meet the given requirements.

- 1. The selection process must be initiated and maintained with the concurrence and decision of the current President, President Elect and Youth Service Director.
- 2. Each application must be accompanied by a resolution of the Board of Directors of the club, of the current year. This includes a provision of three host families for the incoming student necessary for LT programme, each of which will host the student for a minimum duration of three months each. The format of the Resolution is attached herewith.

- 3. If there is more than one application and they meet with the criteria of sponsorship, the Club can sponsor all the candidates for the district interview. However, the club must provide a list of at least three host families for each of the candidates sponsored for District selection.
- 4. Rotarian and Non-Rotary children are welcome to participate.
- 5. The sponsored student's parents must be well educated and encouraged to take part in Rotary Foundation activities and encouraged to host the student.
- 6. The club should undertake in writing to host the inbound student in the same year or subsequent 2 years thereafter.

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR STUDENTS

- 1. The student should be above average in his/her studies
- 2. Should have good command over languages—Gujarati, Hindi, English (Most Important)
- 3. Must be good in extra-curricular activities
- 4. Must have good general knowledge and must be familiar with affairs of India and the world.
- 5. Must have good knowledge of Indian culture
- 6. The student should be broad minded, flexible and should be able to adapt to new customs and habits.
- 7. The student for the long-term youth exchange programme must be between 15 and 18 years old as on June 2026. The student for the short-term youth exchange programme must be between 15 and 19 years old as on June 2026. For the New Generations Service Exchange, students between the ages 18 to 30 (June 2026) are welcome to apply. New Generations Exchanges will be Short-Term.
- 8. The student should be physically fit to participate in the programme. Special Exchange programmes are available for physically challenged students. Their selection criteria are different and Rotary International encourages such exchanges.
- 9. The parents must be able to financially support the student. While home stay and school education are free, typical costs to be paid by the student include selection process cost, travel, local sightseeing tours, 3060 orientation programmes, and other incidental costs.
- 10. The parents should give unqualified freedom and support to their ward to participate in the programme.

The application form is enclosed with this circular. A Demand Draft of Rs. 5000/- should be drawn in favour of "RI District 306 Trust account IYE" (Please note it is 306 and not 3060), payable at Valsad (Bulsar). The last date for accepting applications is 5th September 2025. District interviews will be held soon thereafter. The application fees is non-refundable. Candidates will be required to travel with their parents and club representative to the city of the interview as may be notified. Kindly send in your completed forms along with the demand draft, board resolution and other attachments. Incomplete applications will be rejected.

If the candidate is selected, they will have to pay participation fees of Rs. 9,000 for short term programme. Rs.17,000 for long term programme. For 1:1 NGSE Programme the charges will be Rs. 9,000 and for group NGSE programme the charges will be Rs. 25,000.

Sang Koo Yun resigns as 2026-27 Rotary International President



Dear Rotary Members,

As you may recall, last April, President-elect Sang Koo Yun informed us all of his diagnosis of pancreatic cancer and his decision to step back from Rotary responsibilities so he could focus on his treatment. **Today, President-elect Sang Koo notified me in a letter that he has decided to resign as President-elect of Rotary International after extensive consultation with his doctors. In his message, he shared the following sentiments:**

"My doctors have advised that it may not be possible for me to meet the demanding travel and schedule required of our President. As much as I wish to serve in this role, I must honour that advice."

"It has been a tremendous honour and pleasure to be given the opportunity to lead our organization. I will continue to serve however I can, and my love for Rotary and my commitment to our mission remains unshaken."

On behalf of the Rotary International Board and with a heavy heart, I accepted Sang Koo's resignation. While it is a difficult decision, we deeply appreciate Sang Koo's thoughtful consideration and his focus on the best interest of Rotary.

DO YOU KNOW!!



A man knocked down a wall in his basement in 1963 and discovered an 18-story underground city in Derinkuyu, Turkey, built to shelter 20,000 people.

What he found was a sprawling labyrinth diving 279 feet into the earth, a world carved from volcanic rock centuries ago.

The city wasn't just a series of caves. It had everything needed for long-term survival: stables for livestock, chapels for worship, a religious school, and even wine and oil presses. Its origins go back to the Phrygians around the 8th century B.C., who likely built the first levels for protection from invading armies.

Centuries later, early Christians fleeing Roman persecution expanded the city significantly. They used its hidden depths as a sanctuary, adding the chapels and living quarters that remain to this day. Massive, rolling stone doors, some weighing over 1,000 pounds, could be sealed from the inside, making it a nearly impenetrable fortress. Intricate ventilation shafts provided fresh air to the deepest levels.

The city was last used by Cappadocian Greeks, who took refuge there until they were forced to leave in 1923. It then lay forgotten.
