

Rotary honours a teacher and mentor with the 2025 Sylvia Whitlock Leadership Award



The 2025 recipient of Rotary's <u>Sylvia Whitlock Leadership Award</u> combines a longstanding commitment to empowering women with a talent for teaching and mentorship. Ayda Özeren, a member of the Rotary Club of Izmir-Gündogdu, Izmir, Turkey, is an author, mediator, and professional speaker whose work has touched the lives of as many as 11,000 women and girls.

"We have to change the leadership process. We should make more women leaders," she says. Özeren has spent years conducting financial literacy workshops for women as well as organizing mentorship opportunities and tutoring programs for girls. She published a book and donated all the proceeds to funding girls' scholarships. In 2023-24, as governor of Rotary District 2440, she took the lead in relief efforts for victims of the 2023 Turkey-Syria earthquakes.

"I find her remarkable and inspiring, because whatever she does, she does it with her heart," says Yeşim Yöney, a member of the Rotary E-Club of District 2440, who co-nominated Özeren for the award. "She's a hard worker, a good planner, and she is somebody who is positive, who embraces people. I think that's a very important thing in a leader."

Özeren studied political science, international relations, and marketing. While pursuing a career in the banking industry, she learned how to be a teacher. She began conducting financial literacy seminars after her bank developed a program to provide startup funding to female entrepreneurs. Through Rotary, she led similar classes for women in rural areas, factories, and schools. She visited more than 100 factories and small manufacturing companies, educating around 8,000 women about finances and economic empowerment. It was by teaching others, Özeren says, that she learned how to lead.


"As a result of doing so many coaching programs, I became a facilitator. I became a trainer," she says.



"THE EVOLUTION OF TAMIL, SANSKRIT, AND HINDI: A JOURNEY THROUGH INDIA'S LINGUISTIC HERITAGE"

Tamil language structure is very different from that of sanskrit and Tamil among the bharatiya languages has the least influence from Sanskrit

Even the influence happened more in recent centuries if not 1-2 millenniums

Bhagwan Shiva taught Sanskrit grammar to Panini and Tamil grammar to Agasthya at the same time.

Shiva set the Kaal matra (time) for each syllable of sanskrit from the right side of his damru and for tamil, from the left side of his damru.

Samskrutam was created as inter galectic communication language as Deva Basha and Tamil was created for ordinary humans as Manushya Basha.

So Tamil has less letters and essy on pronunciation compared to Samskrutam.

Samskrutam was kept only as a phonetic language for long.

But due to the deterioration of memory power among the humans, a need for written script arose.

Brahmi script for tamil was created first to fill the gap.

The early form of Samskrutam used in Tamil land was Prakrutam.

In South Bharat, they were using Grandham as the script for Prakrutam (which has many common letters with Malayalam)

Most of the kings in South Bharat kept all the royal records in Prakrutam and used the language for temples.

They used Tamil for the communication with the masses as most of them were not proficient in Prakrutam.

The Devanagari script for Samskrutam came much later. But Samskrutam was always emphasised as a phonetic language and memory power is more important due to that

Hindi as a language was created much much later

By 10 th century, a dialect called "Khari Boli" became more prominent among the various north bharatiya dialects, most of which were spoken without written scripts.

Khari Boli can be said to be the mother of Hindi language

Due to the influences of Persia first and later from the Turkish language, Khari Boli took the form of present day Hindi.

The moghuls named the language as Hindi after the name of Sindhu river, since for them, the land east of Sindhu river was referred as Sindhu Sthan and their language Sindhi.

S was pronounced with H sound by them. So it became Hindusthan and Hindhi.

Since the commonality between Tamil and Hindi is very less

Since there was not much need for the commoners of South , Hindi was not getting popular in south bharat.

But the other south Bharatiya languages like Marathi, Telugu, Kannada and Malayalam were later influenced more by Samskrutam and so they started following samskrutam model than Tamil model.
