<u>Last meeting – Wednesday, January 8, 2025</u> <u>Speaker meeting: - Shri Sanjay Choksi</u> <u>Topic: - "સુરત સોના ની મુરત"</u>





Our club held a highly engaging and insightful speaker meeting of **Shri Sanjay Choks**i, an eminent writer and historian, a well-respected figure in the industry. Shri Choksi, an expert in various sectors, spoke on the fascinating topic of "**Surat Sona ni Murat**," a subject that resonates deeply with the rich heritage and legacy of Surat.

After the delightful and sumptuous dinner and an enlivening fellowship, the meeting started out with the **welcome address by President PDG. Devendrabhai Shastri**, who not only piqued the audience's curiosity about the topic, "Surat Sona ni Murat," but also underscored Shri Choksi's reputation as a knowledgeable figure in the local community.

PP. Shilpa Shah eloquently introduced Shri. Sanjay Choksi, wherein she outlined Shri Choksi's extensive expertise and deep connection to Surat's cultural landscape.

In his power point presentation, Shri Choksi delved into the history and significance of Surat's association with gold and diamonds, often referred to as **"Sona ni murat**" which translates to **"The Image of Gold,"** metaphorically represented Surat's enduring reputation as a centre of wealth and craftsmanship. His talk covered how Surat evolved as a thriving centre for the trade of precious metals and gems, showcasing the cultural and economic impact of these industries on the local community. Shri Choksi elaborated on Surat's historical role in global trade and its transformation into a hub for artisans and entrepreneurs.

Shri Sanjay Choksi painted a vivid picture of Surat's illustrious past, shedding light on the city's historical significance and its role in global trade. He began by highlighting a fascinating fact: Surat was the **only port in India** for the **export and import of goods** during the 17th and 18th centuries. The city was not only a key domestic trade hub but also had a remarkable reach, engaging in trade with a staggering **84 ports worldwide**. This vast network of international trade established Surat as a bustling cosmopolitan city, rich in cultural and economic exchange long before it became a modern-day business powerhouse.


Shri. Sanjay Choksi further captivated the audience with an intriguing historical titbit: the **castle of Surat** was built in **1373 AD**, marking the city's strategic importance as a trading centre in ancient India. The castle, an emblem of the city's long-standing prominence, served as both a fortification and a symbol of Surat's connection to maritime trade.

He also spoke of the **diamond trade**, which was started in **1900** by two visionary brothers. This pivotal moment in Surat's history laid the foundation for what would become a global leader in diamond cutting and processing. Over the years, Surat has earned its reputation as the "**diamond city**," contributing significantly to the global diamond industry.

Additionally, Choksi touched upon the **textile industry**, which was already well-established during those times. Surat's cloth industry was thriving with a **turnover of 30 lakhs per day** in the olden times, further solidifying the city's status as a major commercial centre. The combination of the flourishing textile and diamond industries contributed to Surat's remarkable economic growth, making it a symbol of prosperity and craftsmanship.

As the evening drew to a close, **PP. Setu Gandhi proposed a hearty vote of thanks.** With his warm and gracious words, PP Setu expressed the Rotary Club's sincere appreciation to the distinguished speaker, **Shri Sanjay Choksi**, and the members of **the Atulya Varso** team who had also graced the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned after **Hon. Jt Sec. PP. Ashit Kothari** made the necessary announcements of the forthcoming meetings and also the birthday and anniversary greetings.


Rotary Rose Parade Float Parade- January 1


