HIGHLIGHTS BOD MEETING JUNE 25



Highlights from the June and "July" 2025 Rotary International Board of Directors Meetings

The 2024-25 RI Board of Directors held a special, virtual meeting on 14 June 2025. On 19 June, the Board met in-person in Calgary, Alberta, Canada in conjunction with the Rotary International convention and reviewed six committee reports and recorded 32 decisions. The 2025-26 RI Board met on 26 June after the RI convention to discuss the year ahead and adopt various operational decisions before taking office, with such decisions being effective only on 1 July.

Administration

The Board

- in a specially called, virtual meeting on 14 June, elected Francesco Arezzo as the 2025-26 Rotary International president, to fill the vacancy upon then-president-elect de Camargo's resignation from the office;
- designated the following sites for the 2025-26 zone nominating committees for RI director:

Zone 4: Delhi, India Zone 15: Cologne, Germany Zone 6: Calcutta, India Zone 24A: Amambai, Brazil Zone 10A: Manila, Philippines Zone 26: Phoenix, AZ, United States Zone 30: Columbus, OH, United States Zone 12: Changwon, Korea

and appointed a convener for each committee;

agreed that representatives for the 2028 Council on Legislation will begin their terms on 1 January 2026 and end on 30 June 2028 and requested district governors to submit their selections to the Secretariat by 31 December 2025.

Clubs and Districts

The Board

- encouraged Rotary members, district, and zone leaders to support young leaders to form regional or international networks of alumni associations or multidistrict information organizations;
- agreed to resume its funding for the continuation of the Zone 8 Regionalization Pilot for another year.

Meetings

The Board

- tentatively selected the following cities to host Rotary International Conventions:
 - Dubai, UAE on 26-30 June 2027; 0
 - Honolulu, Hawaii, USA, on 5-9 June 2032.

Finances

The Board

- approved a 2025-26 budget of US\$137,903,000 total revenue, \$138,124,000 total expenses, and funding from reserves of \$385,000;
- approved use of \$125,928,000 from unrestricted contributions for the 2025-26 Rotary Foundation programs budget.































Decisions from the first meeting of the 2025-26 RI Board of Directors

The Board

- approved director Alain Van de Poel as the 2025–26 Rotary International vice president;
- approved director Patrick Eakes as the 2025–26 Rotary International treasurer;
- agreed that Zones 2, 9, 13A, 17A, 21B, 25B, 28, and 33 shall select committees in 2025-26 to nominate RI directors to serve on the Board beginning 1 July 2028;
- established a steering committee to begin the RI Bylaws-mandated process of reviewing the composition of Rotary's 34 zones, to include recommended criteria, guidelines, and timetable for the process.

Famous "Failures" Who Changed the World!



- ◆ **Thomas Edison** was expelled from school after only four months; his teacher labelled him mentally deficient. He later became one of the greatest inventors in history.
- ◆ **Charles Darwin** was pressured to abandon medicine, with his father saying bitterly: "You care about nothing but your fantasies!" He ultimately revolutionized biology with his theory of evolution.
- ◆ **Walt Disney** fired from a newspaper job for "lacking creativity". He then built an entertainment empire beloved by generations worldwide.
- ◆ **Beethoven's** music teacher called him utterly talentless. He went on to compose some of the world's most timeless masterpieces.
- ◆ **Albert Einstein** didn't speak until age four, and his teacher labelled him as mentally handicapped. He became one of history's greatest scientific minds.
- ◆ Auguste Rodin's father declared him an "idiot" after failing the art school entrance exam three times. Rodin is now celebrated as one of the greatest sculptors of all time.
- ◆ Emperor Ferdinand famously criticized Mozart's "The Marriage of Figaro" as having "too many notes." Today, Mozart's genius is unquestionable.
- ◆ **Dmitri Mendeleev** earned average marks in chemistry, yet he later crafted the Periodic Table, fundamentally transforming science.
- ◆ Henry Ford, the legendary creator of Ford automobiles, struggled with basic literacy and declared bankruptcy multiple times before achieving monumental success.
- ♦ When **Marconi** invented the radio and described transmitting words through the air, his friends took him to a psychiatrist, thinking he'd lost his mind. Months later, his invention saved countless lives at sea.

Lesson Learned:

Never let the judgments of others define your potential. Greatness often starts with setbacks. Keep believing in yourself!


