




HEARTFELT CONGRATULATIONS!

HINDI AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE OF ROTARY!

The recent good news is that Council on Resolutions (online) has adopted and recommended to RI Board to approve a Resolution to consider Hindi as an official language of Rotary.

At present the official languages of Rotary International are English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, and Spanish.

It is interesting to know that while the official monthly magazine of Rotary International is in English, Rotary also produces periodicals in over 20 languages, (including Hindi) which are distributed in **130 countries**.

So, what will change if Hindi is adopted as an Official language of R.I.?

- 1. Interpretation services: Rotary provides interpretation services in multiple languages for conventions, including the opening ceremony, general sessions, and closing ceremony. Hindi will be offered as an additional language of interpretation.
- 2. Breakout sessions in Conventions are usually conducted in English, but some may be offered in other languages. Breakout Sessions now may be conducted in Hindi! Thus, we can have Breakout Session dedicated to issues in Zones 4, 5, 6 & 7. That will give great recognition for our region!
- 3. Important publications like Workbooks for Governors Elect, Governor Nominees, DLFs, Club Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, Committees etc. will now be officially printed in Hindi. That will facilitate better learning for our leaders and our Clubs.
- 4. Even our Regional Seminars like Institutes may now be partly conducted in Hindi!

However, it is important to realise that RI Board has to approve the Resolution to make it a rule.

Considering the membership of about 1,75,000 in our zones, let us hope that RI Board accepts and we rightfully get Hindi as one of the Official Languages in Rotary!

IMPORTANT UPDATES TO DRFC POLICY

Effective Immediately

The following changes are made to the District Rotary Foundation Committee Chair (DRFC) policy:

- 1. DRFCs May Serve a Fourth Year: A fourth year is allowed to give districts more time to identify and train a new chair.
- 2. DRFCs Cannot Serve More Than Four Years: To create more opportunities for members to serve, DRFC terms are limited to a maximum of four years.
- 3. DRFCs Cannot Hold Other Major Rotary Roles: DRFCs must focus solely on promoting Rotary Foundation goals, including increasing giving, participation in Annual Fund and PolioPlus, and involvement in grants. They cannot hold other significant roles such as governor, regional leader, or club leadership positions.
- 4. Replacing a DRFC: A DRFC can be replaced if all governors during their term agree. Trustee approval is no longer required, but patterns of frequent replacements will be monitored.
- 5. Selecting a New DRFC: If a DRFC resigns or is replaced, the new chair will serve the remainder of the current Rotary year plus a standard three-year term. The new DRFC must be jointly selected by the governor, governor-elect, governor-nominee, and governor-nominee designate (if applicable).
