HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2ND BOARD MEETING FOR RY 2025-26 HELD ON APRIL 26, 2025

The second Board Meeting of the Rotary Club of Surat for RY 2025-26 was held on April 26, 2025, at Dr. Sarosh Bhacca Memorial Rotary Hall, Nanpura, Surat.

- President Rtn. Kundan Shah called the meeting to order and welcomed all members.
 Updates were shared regarding committee meetings conducted under Club Service, Service Project, Foundation, and Public Image avenues.
 - Members were briefed on participation in District events such as Pre-PELS/SELS and PELS/SELS.
 - The forthcoming District events GMS and CLLS at Surendranagar on May 17–18, 2025 were discussed in detail.
 - Key projects under consideration were reviewed, including:
 - o Provision of medical equipment to various hospitals,
 - o Installation of solar power systems at educational institutions,
 - o Installation of water heaters and assembly hall/shed facilities at schools.
 - Updates were shared on sponsorship efforts for the HUMF project, scholarship proposals, and financial commitments from club members.

New membership proposals currently under consideration were also discussed.

Tree plantation drives and distribution of water bottles as part of the "Reduce, Reuse" initiative were deliberated.

- 2. The minutes of the 1st Board Meeting held on January 4, 2025, were read and confirmed unanimously.
- 3. Names of Chairmen and Co-chairmen of various committees were proposed by Avenue Directors. These were approved unanimously, subject to confirmation from the respective members.
- 4. It was decided to hold the Club Assembly on June 13, 2025. All Board Members were requested to ensure their presence.
- 5. Preparations for the Installation Ceremony scheduled for June 24, 2025, were reviewed.
- 6. The schedule for weekly meetings in July 2025 was finalised. Events include Speaker Meetings, a Talent Hunt, a Varsha Geet programme, and a Friendship Day celebration. A picnic was proposed for July 12–13, with discussions around potential locations, budget, and duration.
- 7. Monthly Service Projects (MSP) for July were discussed which includes;
 - o Blood Donation Camps,
 - o Nutritional Kit Distribution under HUMF.
 - o Tree Plantation,
 - o Club Talent Hunt Competition.
 - o Adopting a GKP village was also considered, with Amalsadi identified as a potential location.
- 8. Any Other Matter:
 - o Advertising opportunities in the District Directory were discussed.
 - o The TRF MOU for 2025-26, received from the District, was circulated among members. It was approved, and the President 2025-26, President 2026-27, and Foundation Chair were authorised to sign the MOU post club approval.
 - o Directors presented outlines for major service activities, public image initiatives, and foundation goals for the upcoming year.

The meeting concluded with a Vote of Thanks delivered by Rtn. Harshad Kinkhabwala.

The month of April is annually designated as "Rotary's Magazine Month," an occasion to recognize and promote the reading and use of the official RI magazine, The Rotarian, and the regional magazines.

The Rotarian has been around since 1911 as the medium to communicate with Rotarians and to advance the program and Object of Rotary. A primary goal of the magazine is to support the annual theme and philosophy of the RI president and to disseminate information about new and special programs, major meetings and the emphasis of the several official "months" of Rotary.

The Rotarian provides a forum in which both Rotary-related and general interest topics may be explored. The magazine serves as an excellent source of information and ideas for programs at Rotary club meetings and district conferences.

Many articles promote international fellowship, goodwill and understanding. Regular readers usually have superior knowledge of the activities of Rotary and how each Rotarian may be more fully involved in the Four Avenues of Service around the world.
