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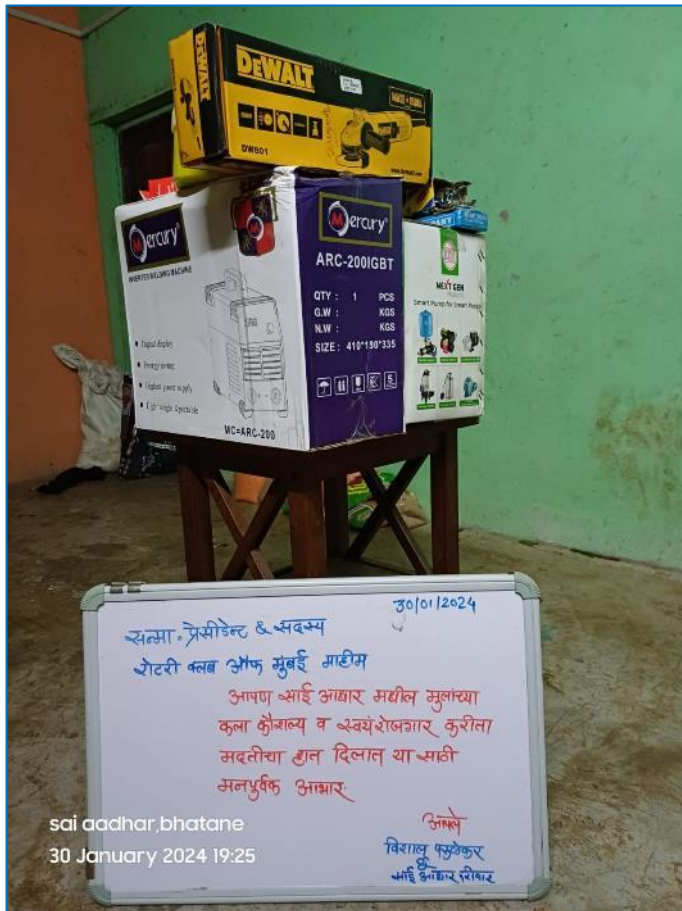
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DONATION OF WELDING KITS TO SAI AADHAR HOME

Vishal Parulekar runs the Sai Aadhar Orphanage near Virar. He lost his parents when he was just 4 years old. Despite facing tough times, he managed to earn a BA degree with a Gold Medal from Mumbai University. At the age of 22, he decided to adopt orphaned children so that they wouldn't have to suffer like he did. He has since adopted over 70 children who were abandoned or lost their parents. RCMM has been supporting Sai Orphanage since last year.

Recently, we received a request letter from Vishal Parulekar of Sai Orphanage Home. He requested welding kits as two boys under his care are studying welding technology. These kits not only support their education but can also help them find employment in their village. Recognizing the importance of the kit, RCMM procured it from a local vendor and handed it over to Sai Orphanage Home.

DONATION OF CUPBOARDS FOR SCHOOL LIBRARY

Since last year RCMM has been associated with Shri Devi Shantadurga High school, a remarkable institution known for its emphasis on both academic excellence and professional skill development. The school is located in a remote area with not much facilities, no amenities, no great Laboratories but still students and their devoted teachers have done wonders. RCMM received a request through Rtn. Rashmi for the cupboards to store the books. Responding to this need, Rtn. Seema generously donated one cupboard, while the second was sponsored by the RCMM Trust.

On 13th February, 2024 the cupboards were officially handed over to the school, with Rtn. Rashmi inaugurating the event by cutting the ribbon. Looking ahead, we remain committed to supporting the school in its endeavors.

FIRST HAND EXPERIENCE OF HEART TRANSPLANT

Rtn. Dr. Shobha Patkar invited a very special guest speaker, Mrs. Seema Banhatti to share her First-Hand Experience of Heart Transplant. She narrated her husband Dr. Rajeev Banhatti's, journey from youthful optimism and a promising career in child psychiatrist, through years of living with a steadily worsening heart condition, to the long wait for life-saving transplant surgery and beyond.

During the years of steadily worsening heart condition, Dr. Rajeev wrote how he is going through and still trying to enjoy the life. After his death Mrs. Seema Banhatti released the book 'Second Time Around' to help others on a similar journey. His memoir tells how he coped with the emotional roller-coaster of living with a life-threatening heart condition, his determination to live life to the full despite his- worsening health, how he maintained hope through the dark times, and the intense gratitude he felt for his second chance at life.

Dr. Rajeev, was diagnosed with a rare type of cardiomyopathy in 2011 and had a successful heart transplant in 2014 after a long wait. Following the surgery, he had another eight years with his family and was dedicated to continuing to help others through his career. His journey was unlike others and he had four episodes of rejections in the first year following his transplant, which made for a challenging time.

Mrs. Seema said: "In spite of all the ups and downs he was always there for his family, friends and the people who needed him until his death. She could cope up through these difficult times, one because of Rajeev's positive attitude and second, she attended Vipasana sessions".

It was quite frightening to listen through the episode but "When we meet real tragedy in life, we can react in two ways – either by losing hope and falling into self-destructive habits, or by using the challenge to find our inner strength."





MOTIVATIONAL AND CARRIER GUIDANCE SESSION

After Dr. Ajay Darekar successfully conducted a Motivational and Career Guidance session at CSV, Dadar Vidya Mandir requested a similar session for their 10th Standard students. Dr. Darekar, an entrepreneur and founder of Versatile educaare system, aims to help students and youths discover themselves and unleash their true potential through creative communication, enthusiasm, listening, and empathetic skills.

The session took place on 8th February, 2024. It began with the Principal felicitating Dr. Ajay and PR Pradnya. Dr. Darekar's ability to connect with students was evident from their smiling faces. He taught them techniques for memorizing topics through visualization and emphasized the importance of proper posture, hydration, and meditation to enhance memory power. Overall, the session was fantastic, with students freely communicating and asking questions. Teachers requested similar sessions in the future.

Representatives from RCMM, including PR Pradnya and Rtns. Archana, Arati, Shaila, and Vrushali, attended the session, which was attended by about 60 students and teaching staff.



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GYM EQUIPMENT TO DEEPSTAMBH FOUNDATION MANOBAL

Deepstambh's Manobal is a non-profit Organization (NGO) working towards holistic quality education for all since 2009. It is India's first residential institute giving training for competitive examinations, technology and personality development to persons with disabilities, orphans, transgender and economically weaker students. Manobal also assists, students to get higher education and is dedicated to providing accessible and inclusive quality education. Currently they are present at Jalgoan and Pune in Maharashtra. The campus has Accessible Facilities, Digital Classrooms, Reading Room, Library, Computer Training Centre, Personality & Career Counselling Centre, Research Centre for PWD, Learning Laboratory, Music Training Centre, Handicraft Training & Production Unit, Health Check-up Centre, Gymnasium & Sports Centre and Girls' and Boys' Hostels.

PR Pradnya visited the campus on 21st February, 2024 and donated exercise bars requested by them. For all the children residing on the campus 20 hours exercise per week is compulsory. PR Pradnya also attended the evening Prarthana and it was a great experience.



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DONATION OF WHEEL CHAIR BATTERY

The story of Gopinath Sawant, a resident of Sewri, is truly touching. Despite facing a devastating railway accident that cost him both his legs, he didn't lose hope. As the sole breadwinner with two daughters and a son who is deaf, the situation was dire for his family. However, Gopinath's resilience is remarkable.

Refusing to be defeated, he turned to digital media in search of a motorized wheelchair donor to help him secure employment. His perseverance paid off when he received a New Motion Wheelchair. With this newfound mobility, he began working with Zomato, earning Rs. 200 to 250 per day. Yet, his determination didn't stop there.

Facing the challenge of limited battery life, Gopinath sought assistance to acquire an additional battery, enabling him to travel longer distances and earn more income. Approaching Rtn. Shital, known for her charitable work, he found support. The proposal for providing the battery was swiftly approved by RCMM members.

When Gopinath attended the Club Meeting on 23rd February, 2024, he expressed heartfelt gratitude to all the members for their assistance. Their overwhelming response and genuine happiness to see the smile on Gopinath's face showcased the power of compassion and community support.

Abida War embodies Kashmir's spirit and serves as a vital connection between Kashmiri girls and the army, being a fearless and energetic advocate for peace, progress, and reconciliation. Together with the girls, she led renditions of the National Anthem and orchestrated Tirange marches, exemplifying unity and patriotism.

Throughout day there were quite interesting speakers.

Sarita Jain, a polio-affected girl from a Marwadi family in Orissa, defies odds to become a Chartered Accountant and IRS Officer, currently serving as Deputy Commissioner of Income Tax. Her journey showcases that disability is merely a mindset. With passion, drive, and determination, she breaks through societal biases, supported by her mother, to achieve her aspirations, inspiring the middle class.

Justice Kanthawala has had a distinguished career in law, serving as both an advocate and a judge. Renowned for his fearlessness, he has rendered numerous rulings in favor of justice, captivating audiences with his eloquence and commitment to upholding the law.

Dr. Madhubala Chinchankar-Joshi, the first female doctor to join the Indian mission to Antarctica, delivered a compelling presentation on Antarctic life, highlighting her team's triumphs and challenges. Enduring six months of isolation with endless days and nights, she emphasized the impact of climate change even in remote areas. A tribute to her daring, competence, and passion for innovation.

Zankar Gadkari highlighted the importance of mentors and benefactors in enabling ordinary individuals to achieve extraordinary feats, citing **Dinesh Lad** as a mentor for Previn Sawant, a long-distance channel swimmer.

"Motivational Talks: Chanakya Nite - Navigating the Disruptive World of Tomorrow" presented by Radhakrishnan Pillai, Santosh Nair, and Priyavartha Mafatlal. Vocational awards were presented to celebrities from various fields.

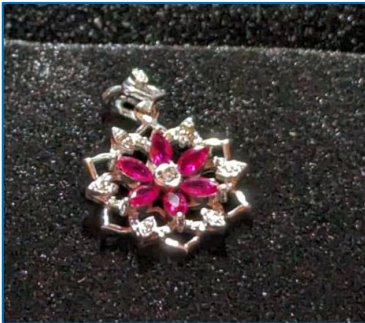

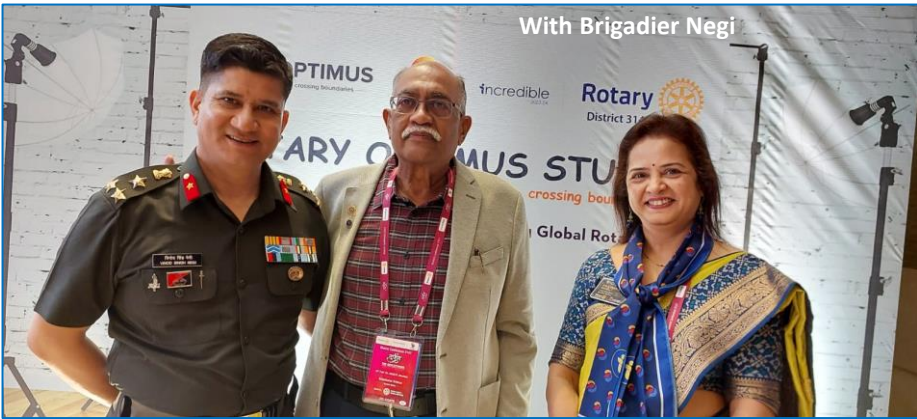

चुकांमधून शिकत गेले!

वर्षभर परीक्षेपुरता अभ्यास करणारी मी! अभ्यासाची आवड कधीच नव्हती. आई मला नेहमी म्हणायची, "तू कांदंबरी वाचताना हरवून जातेस. हाक मारलेलीही ऐकू येत नाही. तसं अभ्यासाच्या बाबतीत होत नाही!" पण याच पुस्तक वाचनानून माझी इंग्रजी भाषा सुधारली आणि आयुष्यात अनेक प्रसंगांत कसं वागावं याचे धडेही मिळाले.

अधिष्ठाता व्हायच्या एक दिवस आधीपर्यंत मी बालचिकित्सा विभागात प्राध्यापक होते. एरवी प्रशासकीय अधिकार्यांना प्रशिक्षण मिळतं कामाचं. तसं काही आमच्या वैद्यकीय क्षेत्रात होत नाही. त्यामुळे अधिष्ठाता झाल्यानंतरही खास प्रशिक्षण असं काही नव्हतं. प्रसंगांना सामोरं जाताना ज्या चुका घडल्या त्या पुढे होणार नाहीत याची काळजी घेत वाटचाल केली. एक गोष्ट प्रकर्षानं जाणवली, की कुठल्याही अवघड परिस्थितीतून बाहेर पडताना मनावरचा ताण कमी करायचा असेल, तर आपल्याला आपल्या क्षेत्राबाहेरच्या व्यक्तींची, आपल्या कुटुंबीयांची अधिक मदत होते. माझ्यासाठी माझ्या जवळच्या व्यक्तींबरोबरच पुस्तकं कायम मार्गदर्शक, मित्रवत राहिली आहेत. पुस्तक वाचनानून अनेकदा कुठल्या प्रसंगाला किती महत्त्व द्यायला हवं? किंवा आपण एखाद्या गोष्टीवर विनाकारण त्राण करतो आहोत अहोत? याविषयीची दिशा मला मिळत गेली. आता अधिष्ठाता होऊन सात वर्षे झाली आहेत. चुका आजही होतात, पण नव्या चुका करते आणि नवं काही शिकते!

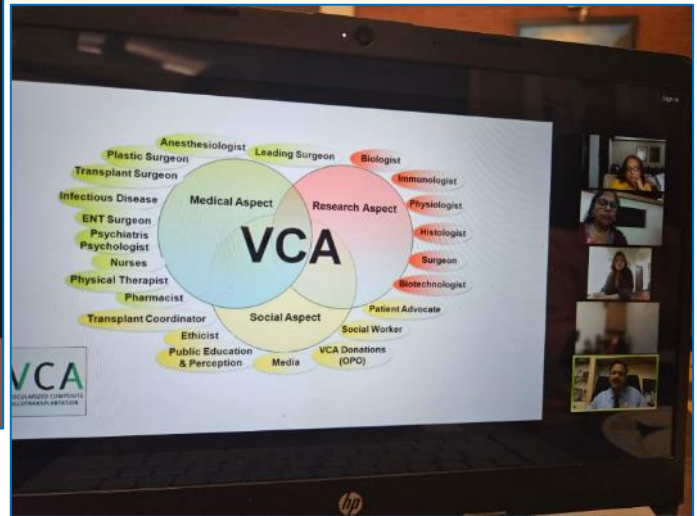
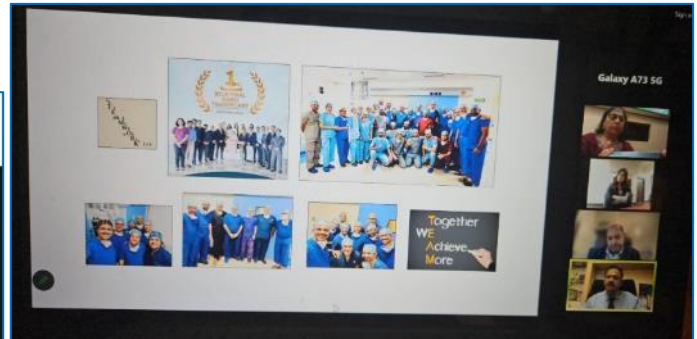

Heartiest congratulations to **Vanaja**, wife of **Rtn. K Suryakumar**, for being the Secretary of the Indian Bonsai Society (IBS), Mumbai and actively participating in the exhibitions held at various locations in Mumbai.

Bonsai is the Japanese art of growing miniature trees in small ceramic pots. Also called 'Vaman Vriksha' the art is centuries old. Many clubs and societies in India are spreading the art of Bonsai throughout the country. It is a good way to preserve trees, get more oxygen, and also display them indoors even in constricted spaces. The Indian Bonsai Society, Mumbai is the pioneer society formed and is celebrating its 52nd year this year.

Recently, on 10th and 11th of February IBS conducted its annual bonsai exhibition at the Friends of Trees Show, held at Ruparel College Mahim and on 17th and 18th February at the MMRDA Show at Nature Park Dharavi. Vanaja had displayed bonsai from her personal collection, creating lovely landscapes. Large number of visitors came to view the exhibits.

She also displayed her stones collection, it is also a Japanese Art, where stones from nature are displayed either on a tray filled with sand or on specially carved wooden based called DAIZAS. The stones are dig out from the mountains or rivers, and cleaned well but not carved or interfered with. They fall into different categories like object stones, landscapes, abstracts etc.
