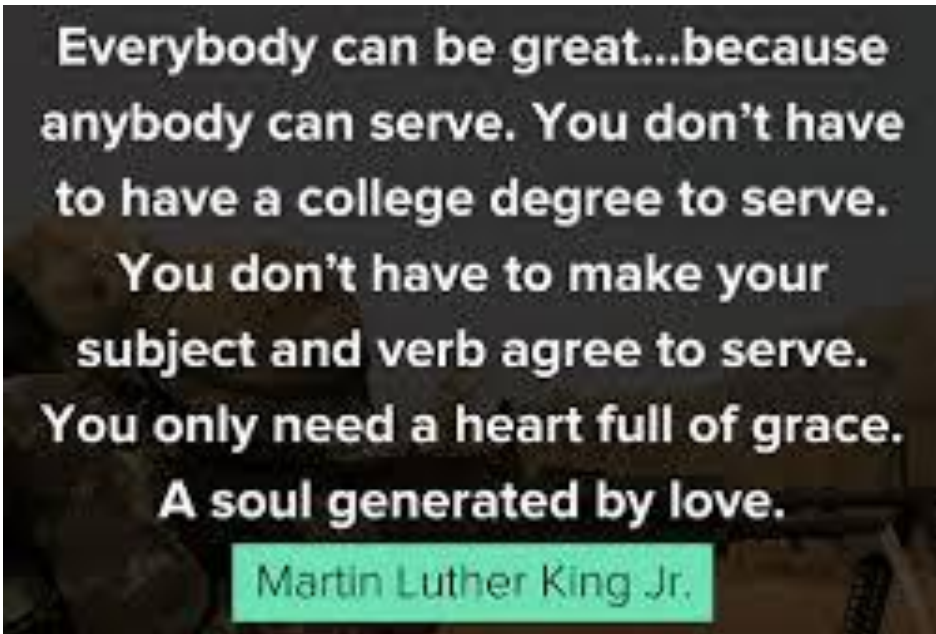
The bonding and happiness quotient among our club members is very high and we are planning our picnic in the next month and also a fellowship dinner is planned in one of the weekly meeting in coming month.

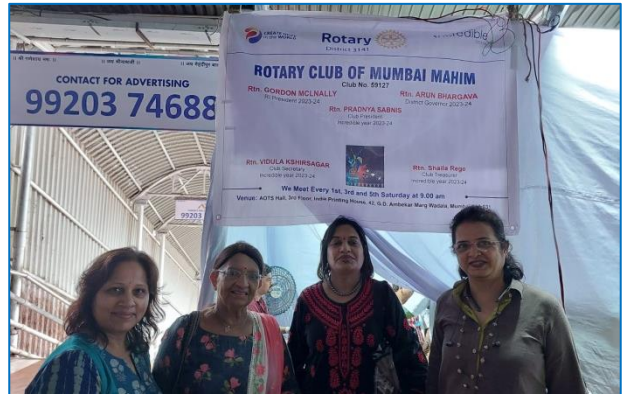

Every year our nation requires about 5 Crore units of blood, out of which only a meager 2.5 Crore units of blood are available. Rotary District 3141 always commences the year by organizing Blood Donation Camps at various railway stations. This year was also no exception. Blood Donation Camp was organized with help of Rotaractors on 1st July, 2023 at Ghatkopar, Mulund and Goregaon Stations. DG Arun Bhargava visited the station and did the opening.

From RCMM Rtms. Dr Sanhita and Bhushan were present from the beginning and PR Pradnya along with Rtms. Vandana, Vrushali and Uma visited the camp after the weekly meeting. Rtms. Uma and Vrushali were continuously on the mike motivating people to donate. Rtn. Vandana donated the blood. At the end of the day total of 219 bottles collected at the various station.

Some facts about Blood Donation:

Blood Needs:

- The gift of blood is the gift of life. There is no substitute for human blood.
- Every two seconds someone needs blood.
- More than 38,000 blood donations are needed every day.
- The blood type most often requested by hospitals is Type O.
- Sickle cell patients can require frequent blood transfusions throughout their lives.
- More than 1 million new people are diagnosed with cancer each year. Many of them will need blood, sometimes daily, during their chemotherapy treatment.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 units of blood

Blood Supply:

- Blood cannot be manufactured – it can only come from generous donors.
- Type O-negative blood (red cells) can be transfused to patients of all blood types. It is always in great demand and often in short supply.
- Type AB-positive plasma can be transfused to patients of all other blood types. AB plasma is also usually in short supply.





PROVIDING SAFE WATER TO DRINK

Water is an essential part of our daily lives. Tap water that we receive is not drinkable. Filtering water can help purify water, removing the impurities and making it safe to drink. Specially in rainy season one has to be still more careful. RCMM received a request from Dadar Vidya Mandir for installation of water filters.

RCMM has been associated with the school and helping them. The students are mainly from Dharavi, underprivileged society. It caters to about 700 students. Rtns Archana and Dhananjay took the lead in understanding the requirements and selected the vendor and ensured that installation is done properly. On 6th July, 2023 Sankashati Chaturthi day PR Pradnya officially inaugurated the water filter in presence of School Principal, teachers, students, secretary of Trust of Dadar Vidya Mandir, Rtns. Shalia, Lalit, Archana, Dhananjay and Vrushali.

EXPLORING HISTORY IN YOUR BACKYARD – DADAR

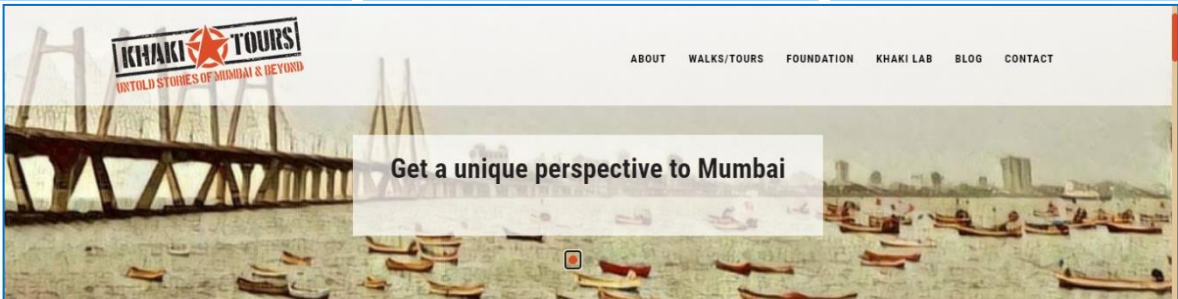

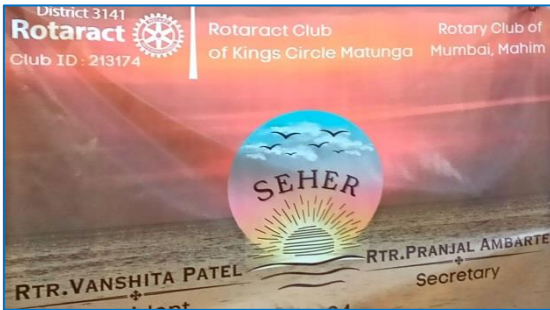


INSTALLATION RC KING CIRCLE MATUNGA

VISIT OF CADRE FOR GLOBAL GRANT PROJECT GG 2001148

Under Global Grant Project GG 2001148 RCMM successfully completed 231 Paediatric Heart Surgeries and final report was submitted to Rotary International by the deadline of end May, 2023. The surgeries were conducted at SRCC Hospital, Hajiali (134 nos.) and Fortis, Mulund (97 nos.). The project was started in February, 2020 and was completed by end May, 2023. It was funded through Global Grant of Rs. 1.91 crores received from RI and approximately equal amount was funded by Government agencies through RBSK and MPJAY schemes. The grant was sanctioned against the contribution of HDFC to TRF Fund and donations from RC Bombay Metropolitan, RC Mumbai Cuff Parade and RC Bombay Airport to TRF Fund. Our International Partner was Rotary Club of Grozny, Russia. Other than RCMM, number of prominent stakeholders were present which was quite complex but at the end it was very exciting and impactful project.

As per RI norms if Global Grant Funding exceeds \$50,000/- for any project, it needs to be evaluated and monitored by a CADRE (specialist in the avenue of the project and knowledgeable on all rotary norms and stipulations). The Cadre's report is an important milestone in RI's acceptance and closure of the GG project.

In our case the Cadre was PDG Dr. Deepak Purohit (Orthopaedic Surgeon) having his own hospital at Panvel. He was a DG in the year 2009-2010 of District 3131, which has around 147 clubs in the jurisdiction of Pune and Raigad. The visit took place on Saturday, 29th July, 2023 and lasted for the whole day.

He attended our Saturday morning meeting and interacted very closely with our members. Subsequent to that he had a one to one discussion with Rtn Prakash Samudra on an overview and execution of the project. Rtn Prakash Samudra was the main spokesperson who organized funds from HDFC and navigated the GG funding from RI.

PDG Dr Purohit visited two hospitals Fortis and SRCC along with Rtns. Dhananjay, Suryakumar and Shobha. At the hospitals he interacted very closely with the Doctors, Administrators and even interviewed parents of children who had undergone the heart surgeries and got a second lease of life. Some children who were 1 to 2 months at the

operation stage and now are healthy babies of 1 to 2 years. He asked very pointed questions to the parents of the children regarding the medical services offered to them and other support facilities given to them during their stay at the hospital. He was very satisfied that the entire operation, transport and stay, were free of charge to the patients (in true Rotary spirit). Subsequently he examined the methodology of how the patients were screened, operated and discharged giving him a firsthand idea of the state of art facilities, competence of the doctors and staff and the dedication with which they discharge their responsibilities. He seemed satisfied the way operations were done and seemed impressed with the close and diligent coordination and rapport which RCMM had with the hospitals.

Subsequently he thoroughly reviewed the documentation of the project, going through the detailed data on the operations/patients/contact details, bank statements, disbursement of funds, utilizations certificate and project publicity - which was through our bulletin Mahim Waves and functions held at the hospitals in presence of DG. He gave us a clean chit the way project was executed and controlled. He specially recognized the efforts in executing the project in spite of the constraining conditions of COVID which prevailed during the first two years of the project.

He also mentioned that on stewardship and sustainability aspects, we have performed very well in this project. The active involvement and interest shown by a large number of RCMM members caught his attention and applauded RCMM for the same.

There was a concluding meeting at the end in the presence of RCMM members. He summarized his observations and findings (as indicated above) and had no adverse remarks on the same. Regarding the area of improvement he dwelt at length on the lack of publicity given to Rotary Efforts for the great work they are doing for the community around them. None of the patients knew that Rotary Mahim played a major role in the medical assistance given to their children. He suggested that the discharge file given to each patient should have the Rotary Logo and a letter stating that the operation was made possible (at least partly) by the efforts/financial assistance of RCMM.

At a later stage in life when the child sees this file and the Rotary Logo he/she will remember the role played by Rotary to save his life. He/She will spread the good word of Rotary and become our ambassador of the good we are doing to the community. Some other publicity measures were also suggested by him. We all agreed to his suggestions on the Message of Rotary to the masses, and will take steps to implement them in right earnest.

Rtns. Dhananjay, Suryakumar, Shobha and Vandana (partly) accompanied him for the visits to the hospitals and provided clarifications and information as needed by him. All in all it was a very memorable visit and much to learn from this outstanding PDG Dr. Deepak Purohit. We now await the final acceptance and project closure from RI.

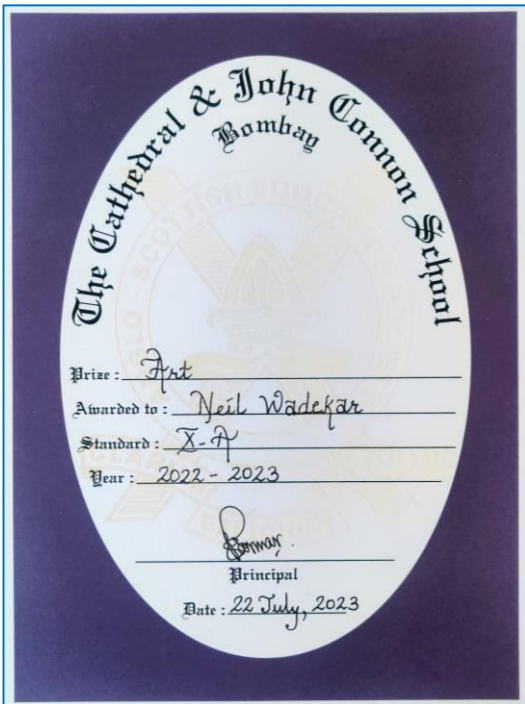
