SCHOOL UNIFORM DISTRIBUTION AT JAGRUTI VIDYAMANDIR

The Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim has been closely associated with Jagruti Vidya Mandir in Govandi for the past 2–3 years. This school primarily serves underprivileged children from the Govandi and Deonar areas—many of whom belong to families involved in waste collection to make ends meet.

On 4th July 2025, school uniforms were distributed to 52 such students. The event was attended by PR Shaila and Rtns. Nita, Lalit, Uma, and Usha, who not only handed over the uniforms but also spent time motivating the children. A special word of gratitude goes to Rtn. Usha for generously sponsoring the uniforms.

These children, many of whom live in slums or work as ragpickers, are lovingly nurtured by the school, which puts in dedicated efforts to instill discipline, hygiene, and moral values. Seeing the pure joy on their faces as they received their new uniforms was deeply touching. It was a heartwarming and fulfilling project that truly embodied the spirit of Rotary—bringing smiles and dignity to those who need it the most.













SEVA MAHOTSAV BY RCKCM AT MATUNGA PREMIER SCHOOL

As part of the District Seva Mahotsav initiative, the enthusiastic Rotaractors of the Rotaract Club of King Circle Matunga (RCKCM) conducted a series of impactful awareness sessions at Matunga Premier School on 5th July, 2025. The sessions were well-coordinated by Rtn. Seema Patole, with active support from Rtn. Nita.

The event was thoughtfully planned to engage students from Grades 5 to 9 and covered a range of sensitive and relevant topics:

- Good Touch, Bad Touch Conducted for students of Grades 5 to 9, this session aimed to raise awareness on personal safety and body autonomy in an age-appropriate and respectful manner.
- Menstrual Health and Hygiene An open, inclusive session for both girls and boys to break taboos, encourage dialogue, and educate young minds on menstrual well-being.
- Sanitary Pad Distribution Drive To promote menstrual hygiene accessibility and ensure that students have the resources they need.
- Anti-Drug Awareness Campaign Addressing the dangers of substance abuse, this session aimed at empowering students with knowledge to make safe choices.

The students responded with great enthusiasm, actively participating and even suggesting future topics such as sessions on Artificial Intelligence and the importance of sensitivity toward girls during menstruation.

This crucial equipment will aid researchers in performing accurate quantitative analysis of biomolecules—critical in studying cancer cells, monitoring drug responses, and advancing molecular diagnostics.

BRINGING DIGITAL ACCESS TO RURAL MAHARASHTRA

Manora, a taluka in Washim district, has long lagged behind in economic, social, and educational development—both within the district and across Maharashtra. Amidst this backdrop, Sant Vaman Maharaj English School was founded 13 years ago by a visionary young man, Abhijit Deshmukh, with a mission to transform the region through quality education.

Today, the school stands tall with over 900 students from nearly 50 surrounding villages and tribal hamlets. What began as a school for children from Banjara communities, tribal groups, and farming families, has now earned the trust of the entire region—attracting students even from the families of doctors and government officers.

This school is not just an educational institution, but a symbol of progress and possibility for rural Maharashtra.

Over the past few years, Rtn. Dr. Ajay Darekar has been actively supporting the school in building confidence and focus among its students. A thought troubled him—if city children have easy access to computers, why should rural students be left behind?

He voiced this concern to PR Shaila, and the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim embraced the cause wholeheartedly. On 8th July 2025, this school in one of Maharashtra's most underserved talukas, 600 km from Mumbai, received four modern computers—a step toward bridging the digital divide.









BRINGING DIGITAL ACCESS TO RURAL MAHARASHTRA

Rtn. Dr. Darekar also conducted a career guidance session for 10th-grade students and their parents, helping them navigate educational and professional choices.

The computers will be installed in a Wi-Fi-enabled corridor for supervised student access, ensuring every child gets vital digital exposure.

The heartfelt gratitude and blessings received today are a true reflection of the impact Rotary continues to make.











SEVA MAHOTSAV BY RCRRC AT MATUNGA PREMIER SCHOOL

As part of the District Seva Mahotsav initiative, the enthusiastic Rotaractors of the Rotaract Club of Ramnarain Ruia College (RCRRC) conducted a series of impactful awareness sessions at Matunga Premier School on 11th July, 2025.

They led a one-hour interactive session with 10th standard students, covering two critical and timely topics: Mental Health Awareness and Digital Safety.

In the mental health segment, students were introduced to the concept of mental well-being, its importance in everyday life, and simple, practical coping strategies to manage stress and emotions effectively. The discussion helped demystify mental health and encouraged openness around the subject.
