FROM PRESIDENT'S DESK



The month of March was very exciting and ended on a happy note.

Fourteen-year-old Kartik, the son of a farmer, successfully underwent surgery for Ventricular Septal Defect with Coarctation of Aorta. The surgery was sponsored by Ms. Jasmin Kikani, a friend of Rtn. Shobha Karnik. This successful surgery marks a new beginning for Kartik and his family and reflects the hope that Rotary brings to those in need.

In association with Manav Sparsh Charitable Trust, a Women's Self-Awareness Programme was organized on 7th March, on the eve of Women's Day, for 80 nurses of Guru Nanak Nursing School which was well appreciated. Rtn. Deepa Mani, Advocate, made them aware of the legal provisions for the protection of women. PSI Rupali Salunkhe from Kherwadi Police Station informed the participants about the Nirbhaya Squad and shared helpline details for reporting cyber crimes such as morphed images and extortion. Mr. Kyoshi Syed Abusad, an international karate instructor, demonstrated self-defence techniques.

Six whiteboards and one 42-inch television were donated to Elly Kadoorie High School. Many of the students studying in this school live on pavements and do odd jobs. The teachers put in tremendous efforts for their education. They expressed their gratitude and said that these facilities would help the students learn in a better way.

Two fully automated beds were donated to Dhanwantari Hospital, Dadar, through the generous contribution of Smt. Julina Karkhanis in memory of her husband, Dr. Ulhas Karkhanis.

Continuing its regular humanitarian support, ration kits were distributed to 10 TB patients, a project that RCMM does every month with commitment and compassion.

The Official Club Visit (OCV) by our District Governor, Dr. Manish Motwani, took place on 28th March with very good participation from Rotarians and Rotaractors. He appreciated for the 100% uploading of the documents of various meetings and about each and every project. He applauded the good efforts of the good work done by RCMM. He emphasized the need to start dispensaries and libraries for slum children. He also suggested administering the HPV vaccine to girls in slum areas to help prevent cervical cancer. He mentioned that many activities can be carried out through CSR support and assured that his team would guide the club in this regard. He also offered to help with funds if required, especially for projects such as the Pink Auto.

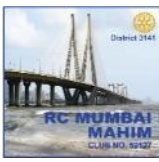

WOMEN'S SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME AT GURU NANAK SCHOOL

On the occasion of Women’s Day, RCMM in association with Manav Sparsh Charitable Trust organized a Women’s Safety Awareness Programme at Guru Nanak School of Nursing, Guru Nanak Hospital, Bandra (E) on 7th March 2026 from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Rtn. Deepa Mani, IPP of RC Chembur (W) and Trustee of Manav Sparsh Charitable Trust, was one of the key speakers. An Advocate and Notary appointed by the Central Government, she provided detailed information on various legal provisions for the protection of women. She spoke about women’s rights related to equality in remuneration, property rights, education, maternity leave, and legal remedies in cases of workplace harassment. She also explained the laws and safeguards available in cases of dowry harassment both before and after marriage.

PSI Rupali Salunkhe from Kherwadi Police Station, Bandra, spoke about initiatives taken by the State Government, including the formation of the Nirbhaya Squad for women’s safety. She explained that the squad functions round the clock and responds immediately to distress calls to assist women in need. She also highlighted crimes against minor children and the strict punishments prescribed under the law. In addition, she shared details of helplines and online platforms available for the immediate removal of morphed images and to prevent online extortion.



WOMEN'S SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME AT GURU NANAK SCHOOL

Mr. Kyoshi Syed Abusad, an international Karate instructor with over 25 years of experience in women's self-defense training, conducted a live demonstration of self-defense techniques. Nursing students actively participated in the session, learning practical methods that can help them protect themselves effectively in threatening situations.

The programme proved to be highly informative and engaging. A total of 70 nursing students and teachers attended the session, along with four members from Manav Sparsh Charitable Trust, four police officers, and the self-defense expert. PR Shaila and Rtn. Lalit were present throughout the session.

DONATION OF WHITE BOARDS AND TV TO ELLY KADOORIE SCHOOL

Sir Elly Kadoorie School, established in 1875 and located in Mazgaon, Mumbai, is one of the city's oldest educational institutions. Affiliated with the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, the school primarily serves children from nearby slum areas, many of whom come from single-parent families. The dedicated teachers work tirelessly to encourage regular attendance and actively promote sports, making full use of the school's excellent playground facilities.

On 9th March, RCMM demonstrated its strong commitment to education by donating six whiteboards and a 42-inch TV to Elly Kadoorie High School. These resources will greatly support the teaching process and help students learn in a more engaging and effective way.

The teachers expressed their sincere gratitude and mentioned that the new equipment will significantly enhance classroom learning for the students.

PR Shaila, along with Rtms. Lalit and Swati, attended the inauguration ceremony. It was a very satisfying and heartwarming experience to witness how this small initiative can make a meaningful difference in the students' education.



PEDIATRIC HEART SURGERIES

In India, thousands of children from underprivileged families suffer from congenital heart diseases that require urgent surgery. For many, financial constraints make such treatment beyond reach — and timely medical support can mean the difference between life and death.

RCMM supports pediatric heart surgeries through Government Scheme at S. L. Raheja Hospital at Mahim. During last years Fund Raise programme we received donation for three surgeries from Jasmin Kikani, friend of Rtn. Shobha. Experiencing the success of three surgeries, she further sponsored for one more.

The surgery took place in the month of February, 2026 of Kartik Chandrakant More, 14 years child operated for Vascular Septal Defect – Coarctation Aorta Defect. His father is a farmer.

This successful surgery marks a new beginning for Kartik and his family, symbolizing the hope Rotary brings to those in need. RCMM remains committed to supporting such life-transforming initiatives that give children a chance to grow, thrive, and live healthy lives. Special thanks to Rtn. 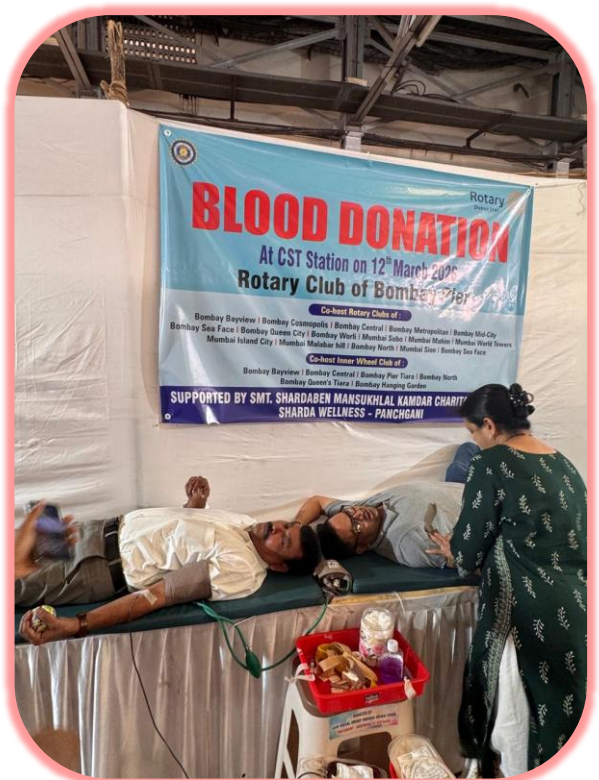

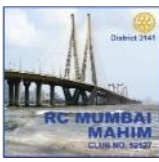

RTN. RAJENDRAN UNNIKRISHNAN ON URBAN WOMEN UPLIFTMENT

Rtn. Rajendran Unnikrishnan, Group Avenue Head – Urban Vocational Upliftment, was invited as a guest speaker on 14th March 2026 to address our club on the topic of Urban Women Upliftment.

During his session, he shared his valuable experiences and highlighted practical ways in which Rotary can support underprivileged women in becoming self-reliant and financially independent. He explained that women can be empowered through skill-based training programs such as the Healthcare Career Training Program, as well as sewing and stitching courses, which can equip them with employable skills and help them earn a stable livelihood.

He also elaborated on the impactful “Pink Auto” project, under which women are provided with auto-driving training and are later supported in purchasing an auto-rickshaw. Rotary assists by contributing a portion of the cost, while the remaining amount is arranged through a bank loan. This initiative not only provides employment but also builds confidence and dignity among women.

The session was highly informative and inspiring, giving us a deeper understanding of the various vocational upliftment projects being undertaken. It truly emphasized that women empowerment is the need of the hour, and RCMM can certainly play an active role in supporting such initiatives and helping women achieve independence.



WAY TO INDEPENDENCE - DONATION OF SEWING

The Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim (RCMM) continues to make a difference in lives through impactful grassroots initiatives. Recently, RCMM donated a sewing machine to Ms. Nandini Kadam from Wadala, enabling her to become self-reliant and support her family financially.

Nandini comes from a humble farming background and works as a maid to earn her livelihood. Having a small baby, it is becoming difficult to work as a maid. She has learnt sewing and stitching enabling her to take up stitching work at home.

The sewing machine was handed over to Nandini on 14th March, 2026 by PR Shaila and Rtn. Pradnya. This small yet significant support is expected to give wings to Nandini's aspirations.



Her pioneering contributions to speech therapy, compassionate service to cancer patients at Tata Memorial Hospital, and lifelong dedication to ethical, patient-centered care are truly inspiring. A trailblazer, mentor, and humanitarian — she continues to be a example of excellence and hope.

DR. GURMIT KAUR BACHHER

Young, desiring lass, Ms. Gurmit Kaur Bachher (Latika V. Bandekar) was eager to opt for a luxurious life. Fortunately, her father, a doctor and his friends, Dr. L.H. Hiranandani and Dean Dr. Kenkare gave her gentle advice about the new field of Audiology & Speech Therapy then. Gurmit took this “voice advice” seriously. She completed her Audiology and Speech Therapy course at Pristine Institute, T.N. Medical College, Bombay (Mumbai) in 1978.

Gurmit was perfectly trained by Voice magnate Prof R. K. Oza. Dr Vijay Shah instilled the concept of ethics & morality. She embraced his message of “Give Space, Keep Space” throughout her life. She had been offering her expertise to Cannosa School for intellectually challenged children for fifteen years. Five years at Navjeevan Hearing Aid Centre gave her insight into various hearing aids.

Ms. Gurmit experienced a Rolls -Royce moment in her life when she was appointed as a Speech Therapist at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. In those days, the term Speech Therapist was Latin to most oncologists and surgeons. Her role became increasingly important and valuable, as she taught alaryngeal speech to beneficiaries, which was then the only mode of esophageal speech. Gurmit, a dream chaser, earned an MA in psychology after ten years in her career. This enhanced her dual role as a speech therapist and psychologist in caring for the psychological needs of cancer patients. Tata Memorial Hospital was generous in offering full funding to Gurmit to pursue a doctorate in psychology. Gurmit became head of the speech therapy department, which was the pinnacle of success. This funding gesture was the first of its kind in the history of Tata Memorial Hospital.

Gurmit further developed the speech therapy department to its full potential. She was the first Indian speech therapist to gain first-hand experience and implement NMES and vital-Stim in clinical practice. Swallowing and FEES equipment for dysphagia became routine in the hospital in the 1990s.

All life was going smoothly until Mr. Narinder Pal Singh Bachher her life partner, met with a car accident. Her family life was wracked. But this theist-gallant Gurmit rose from the crisis to continue her work at Tata until 2016. Gurmit’s compassion for working with the rural population remained with her since her young age. In 1997, Gurmit founded the NGO Maityreyi Mahila Mandal, and she continues to work with the rural population of Sindhudurg district to this day.

Dr Gurmit is acclaimed nationally and internationally. She has travelled to Thailand, Malaysia, Bangladesh, and Karachi to deliver lectures. She was the most laudable speaker at Ziauddin University and its colleges in Karachi, Pakistan. She has attended and presented at international seminars and workshops on many occasions. She has handled twenty projects related to cancer, voice quality after radiation, and swallowing in head and neck carcinoma cases undergoing radiotherapy at Tata Memorial Hospital. Dr Gurmit has created relief and hope of paradise for laryngeal and oesophageal cancer patients in Mumbai.

Dr Gurmit Kaur Bachher has achieved the stature of a signature lady among speech-language pathologists.

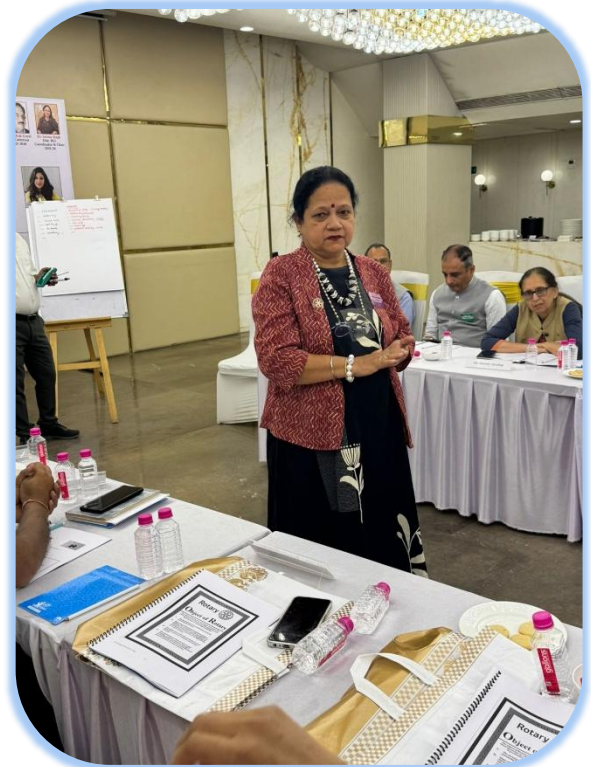
