Richard D. King, past Rotary International president who made humankind his business, dies at 84

Richard D. King, an attorney, educator, and entertainer had a passion for improving people's lives.

A member of the Rotary Club of Niles (Fremont), California, USA, served as Rotary International president in 2001-02. With the theme of Mankind Is Our Business, he encouraged members to extend compassion and aid to people in need and find workable solutions to the world's persistent challenges.

He asked members to reach out and welcome business and professional leaders into Rotary.

He served on the board of advisers of the Wheelchair Foundation and, through that and Rotary, participated in a project that provided thousands of wheelchairs to people around the world.

What he loved most about Rotary was helping people in need. Every second of the day, we heal the sick. We save lives. We bring hope. And we bring peace. And that's the thrust of Rotary. And in so doing, the Rotarian becomes a changed person.

A Rotarian since 1968, King also served as an RI director, Rotary Foundation trustee, International Assembly group discussion leader, and district governor. He received The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award, as well as the PolioPlus Pioneer Award.

He was a senior partner in the law firm of King, King & King and a member of the American Association for Justice. He was admitted to practice law in California, in Utah, and before the U.S. Supreme Court. He held three degrees from the University of California, Berkeley, and received an honorary doctorate in law from Hanyang University in Seoul, Korea. He taught law at Brigham Young University and received the BYU Management Society's Humanitarian of the Year and Distinguished Public Service awards.

King was a distinguished military graduate of the University of California and served on active duty in the U.S. Army in military intelligence. Early in his career, he produced shows and performed as a singer in Las Vegas, at Lake Tahoe, in San Francisco.

King was an active fundraiser for Boy Scouts of America and a member of the Commonwealth Club. He held the

Degree of Chevalier and Legion of Honor from the Order of DeMolay and was inducted into the DeMolay International Hall of Fame. He was a recipient of an order of merit from Italy and a holder of the Tiradentes Medal from Brazil. He was a high priest of the Mormon Church.

King died at age 84 and is survived by his wife, Cherie Kay King, and their two sons, Robert and Tyson.

Past Rotary International President James L. Lacy, an advocate for children, dies at 92

James L. Lacy, a past Rotary International president who was passionate about improving the lives of children and worked tirelessly to raise funds for Rotary's polio eradication efforts, has died at the age of 92.

Lacy, a member of the Rotary Club of Cookeville, Tennessee, USA, for 53 years, served as RI president in 1998-99. His presidential theme, Follow Your Rotary Dream, urged members to turn their dreams into action to address community concerns, particularly the needs of children.

During an address at the 1999 Rotary International Convention in Singapore, he challenged Rotarians to channel their caring into the lives of society's most valuable, yet most vulnerable, members: our children.

Lacy was a member of the Tennessee House of Representatives 1967-70. He served on Rotary's Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force for the United States from 2000 to 2017, including serving as chair and he was an advocate for government support for polio eradication. He played a critical role in securing more than \$2.6 billion in U.S. funding for polio eradication. In 1997, he participated in a National Immunization Day in India, an event that vaccinated more than 127 million children. He was honored as a PolioPlus Pioneer in 2018 for his founding role in the program and his ongoing support.

Lacy joined the Rotary Club of Cookeville in 1964 at age 34. Lacy led a Group Study Exchange trip to England in 1977-78 that "opened his eyes to the internationality of Rotary" and became one of his fondest memories. He also served as president of his club in 1978-79.

In addition to RI president, Lacy served as RI director, Rotary Foundation trustee and trustee chair, district governor, and International Assembly moderator. He received The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service for his support of educational and humanitarian programs, as well as its Distinguished Service Award and RI's Service Above Self Award. He and his spouse, Claudine, are Major Donors.

Lacy was the owner and chair of a confection company. In 1986 he bought Gilliam Candy Brands Inc. in Paducah, Kentucky. He expanded it by buying other candy manufacturing plants in Kentucky as well as Georgia, Kansas, and New York. Before that, he was president of an investment firm and a successful real estate developer. He also served in the military from 1952 to 1954.

In the community, Lacy coached children's baseball for 17 years, beginning with his son's team in 1961. The Lacys were also longtime members of the Presbyterian Church.


In 2005, the Rotary Club of Cookeville established the James L. & Claudine Lacy Children's Fund to enable the Putnam County school system to provide clothes, shoes, and other necessities to students in need. The club named the fund in recognition of Lacy's service as RI president and his

dedication to improving the lives of children around the world.

James L. Lacy is survived by his wife of 74 years, Claudine; his son, Bill, and daughter-in-law, Susie, of Olathe, Kansas; brother, Alvin, and his wife, Barbara, of Sparta, Tennessee; and sister-in-law, Rowena Lacy, of Hickory, North Carolina. 
