In the short span of successful soft landing on Mangalyaan, India accomplished a successful launch of the Aditya-L1 from Sriharikota on September 2023, at 11:50 IST.

Aim of India to launch the Aditya-L1 mission is to study the Sun and its impact on Earth's climate. The mission aims to provide crucial data on solar phenomena and help the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) to plan future astronomy missions.

Aditya-L1 is India's first solar and third interplanetary mission. Aditya-L1 will travel about 1.5 million km to reach Lagrange Point L1 in the Sun-Earth system, where it will observe the Sun without any occultations or eclipses. The spacecraft is equipped with seven payloads, four of which directly observe the Sun, while the other three analyse particles and magnetic fields at and around the L1 point.

The Aditya-L1 mission is important for India because it allows the country to study the Sun directly, rather than relying on data from other nations' solar missions. By studying the Sun's impact on Earth's climate, ISRO aims to gain insights that will help scientists understand space weather and plan future missions more effectively.

World noticed that India has been making significant strides in space technology. Aditya-L1 mission- India's first space-based mission to study the Sun, is a testament to this progress.

- Success of Aditya L1 mission has given India a new level of accreditation in the field of Science and Technology.
- Aditya-L1 mission will enhance India's cost competitiveness in space engineering and boost its privatized space industry. This will attract Investments in space technology and drive innovation, technological advancements, and job creation in related industries. Which can give long-term economic benefits.
- The data collected by the Aditya-L1 mission will help scientists better understand the Sun and its impact on space weather, which can have implications for various sectors such as telecommunications, navigation systems, and power grids.

Let us hope successful mission of Shukrayaan.....and many more.

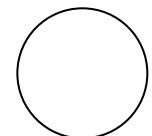
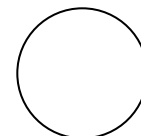

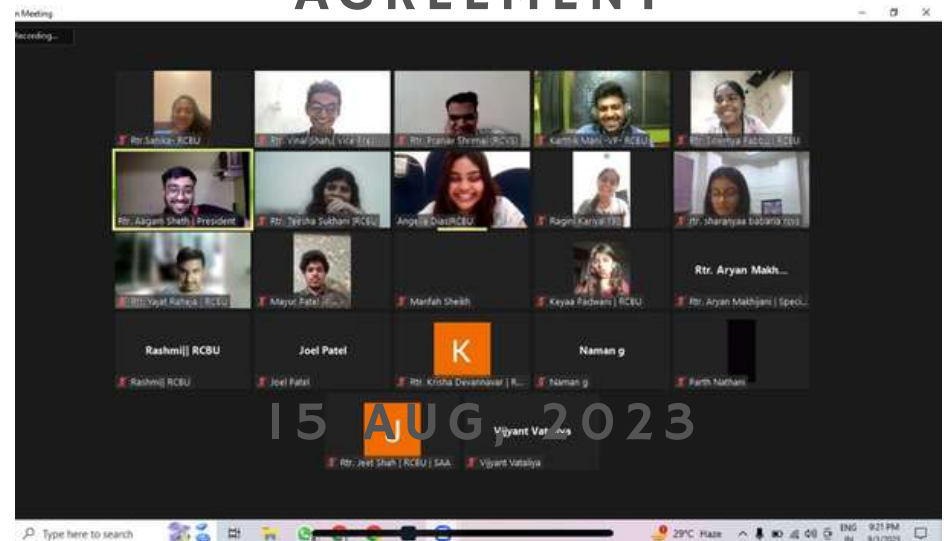
RotaTrek 9.0: Uniting Adventure and Friendship

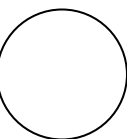
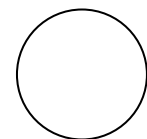
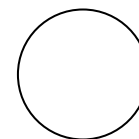
RCVS SISTER CLUB AGREEMENT

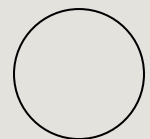
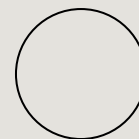

There is a little known close relationship between the United Nations and Rotary which began in 1942, in the war. Rotary clubs from 21 countries organized a conference in London to develop A vision for the advancement of education, science and culture after the war. That event was a precursor to UNESCO. In 1945, a total of 49 rotarians went to San Francisco, acting as delegates, consultants and consultants at the conference on the charter of the United Nations, which entered into force three years later, in 1948.
