# *RCBS PROJECTS*

## *Safe-Unsafe Touch Awareness - 02/09/25*



The Rotary Club of Baroda Sayajinagari, in collaboration with Young India, conducted an impactful awareness session on Safe-Unsafe Touch and Adolescent Guidance at M.K. School. The session, facilitated by Mayuri Gohil and Prachi, guided students in recognizing safe vs. unsafe touch, understanding personal boundaries, and knowing when and how to seek help. To ensure effective engagement, the program was thoughtfully divided into two age-appropriate groups — Standards 5 & 6 and Standards 7 & 8 — where Prachi also led a special segment on Cybercrime Awareness and introduced the Cyber Helpline 1930. Students were further sensitized about CHILDLINE 1098, a 24x7 helpline for children in distress, reinforcing the importance of speaking up and seeking timely support. Attended by Rtn. Seema Thakur and Rtn. Sanyogita Pradhan, the session successfully reached 120 students, equipping them with crucial knowledge for their safety and well-being. Such initiatives play a vital role in empowering children to recognize unsafe situations, protect themselves, and confidently seek help. ## *The Cygnus Interact Club*

*CPR Session - 01/09/25*



On Monday, 1st September 2025, Zydus Hospital conducted an insightful CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) training session for the Interact Club. The session was led by Dr. Gitanjali Gupta, Emergency Medicine Specialist at Zydus, who guided students through the critical steps to take when someone is in a life-threatening situation and how to assess whether CPR is required.

Dr. Gupta explained the six-step process, abbreviated as DRS CAB:

- D – Danger: Check for scene safety
- R – Responsiveness: Assess if the patient is responding by calling their name and checking for pulse and breath
- S – Send for help: Call for an ambulance and arrange for an AED machine
- C – Chest compressions: Performed 5 cm deep into the sternum
- A – Airway
- B – Breaths

She further explained that post-COVID, opening the airway and giving breaths has been discontinued in standard CPR practice. Beyond theory, the session offered valuable hands-on experience as students practiced chest compressions on a dummy, allowing them to understand and apply the technique in real life.

This training proved to be a highly enriching experience, equipping students with a vital skill that could one day help save a life. It not only enhanced awareness about cardiac emergencies but also reinforced the importance of being prepared to support and protect the community in times of need.
