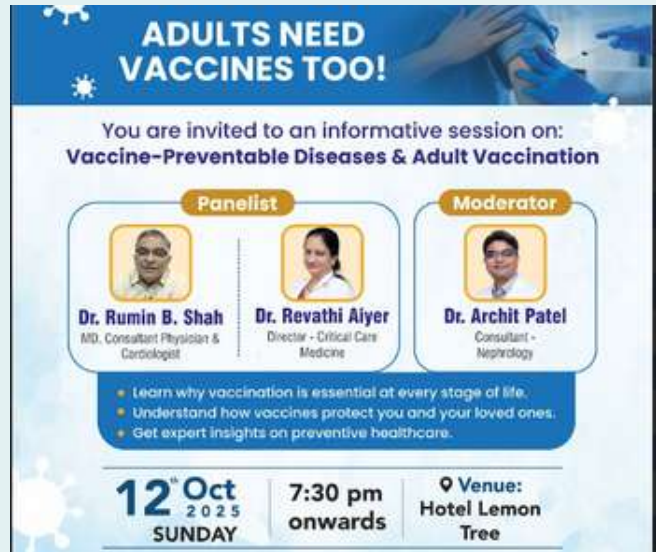
Swaman Store- 09/10/25
