

- DO ALL in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
- BE FAIR to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public, and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
- RECOGNIZE the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
- OFFER my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- ADHERE to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;
- NEITHER SEEK from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
