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# Ms. Smita Goswamy - "The Bestseller Blueprint -How I wrote my way to Transformation" (A Report by Ann Dr. Aditi Vahia)

# **APRIL 2025 Maternal & Child Health**

April is designated as Maternal and Child Health Month by Rotary International. During this month, Rotary emphasizes initiatives aimed at improving the health and well-being of mothers and children worldwide. An estimated 5.9 million children under the age of five die each year due to malnutrition, inadequate health care, and poor sanitation, all of which are preventable.

Rotary's efforts in this area include providing immunizations, antibiotics, and access to essential medical services. They also support training for health care providers to ensure sustainable, community-based health solutions.

Rotary's Impact on Maternal Health - Rotary clubs and partners are carrying out various projects to improve Maternal Health through:

- Mobile clinics to reach women in remote areas
- Training Midwives and Community Health Workers to assist during childbirth and provide prenatal/postnatal care
- Distributing clean delivery kits to prevent infections during childbirth
- Promoting maternal education on nutrition, hygiene, and newborn care
- Establishing maternal waiting homes near hospitals where high-risk pregnant women can stay before delivery
- Advocacy to influence policy and increase government investment in maternal care

Investing in maternal health is not just a healthcare priority—it is a moral, social, and economic imperative. When mothers thrive, families flourish, and communities grow stronger. Every woman deserves access to safe and respectful care before, during, and after childbirth, regardless of where she lives or her economic status.

Through continued support, education, and sustainable healthcare solutions, we can ensure that motherhood is a time of Joy and hope—not Risk
