(A Report by PP Rtn. Chandresh Makhija)

President Rtn. Umed Fifadra and Hon. Sec. PP Rtn Hemang Vahia effectively addressed the club members' needs after welcoming Nine new members in the past 45 days. The task was assigned to PP Rtn. Bhupendra Juneja, who quickly enlisted support from key District leaders and local club members. Rtn. Utkarsh Mehta promptly started the meeting at 11 AM, followed by a prayer from Ann Nitaben Shah and a presentation on Rotary's Four-Way Test by PP Rtn. Chandresh Makhija. President Umed Fifadra led the proceedings, including a moment of silence for Late PP Rtn P. D. Bagriji, and discussed club goals. District Governor Rtn. Tusharbhai, despite his busy schedule, provided insights and motivation on community needs and solutions.

A new member **Mr Manish Shah** was inducted by **DG Rtn. Tushar Shah**. When asked about Rotarians' long-term attachment to clubs, District Governor **Rtn. Tusharbhai** highlighted that philanthropy, community service, and fellowship foster a deep bond among members, making fellow Rotarians feel like a second family. He shared stories of how Rotary's local interventions have significantly impacted communities and explained the role of TRF in funding global projects. The session offered valuable insights into Rotary International's mission and District 3060's role. The club deeply appreciated **Rtn. Tusharbhai's** guidance and presence, marking his third visit this year- a record.

Membership:

PDG Rtn. Jatinbhai Bhatt was invited to speak on membership. In his engaging style, he lightened the serious atmosphere and shared how he joined the club with friends, contributing to its growth in fellowship, sports, and community projects. He praised **President Umedbhai** for successfully inducting 9 out of 10 promised new members and urged all members to attend meetings and projects to strengthen bonds within the club.

Rotary Exchanges:

Rtn. Amul Jikar introduced RYE (Rotary Youth Exchange) Advisor PP Rtn. Dr. Mrugank Merchant, highlighting his dedication to the program, which involves Rotarians' children aged 15-19. Dr. Merchant, a veteran at the District level, has led the Youth Exchange Program for decades. He presented on the benefits of Rotary's Short-Term (30-45 days) and Long-Term (up to 1 year) Youth Exchange Programs, where participants explore culture, customs, and education in their host countries. The program includes home hospitality, with Rotarians reciprocating by hosting students from other countries.

TRF (The Rotary Foundation):

PP Rtn. Chandresh Makhija spoke on the Rotary Foundation (TRF), starting with Rotary's history (founded on Feb 23, 1905) and highlighting how each Rotary International President's annual theme embodies the Rotary spirit of selfless service. He shared examples like PRIP Nitish C Laharry's "Kindle the Spark Within" (1962) and RI President Stephanie Urchick's "Magic of Rotary" (2024). He emphasized how TRF has transformed over \$4 billion in donations into life-changing projects worldwide, urging members to continue supporting these efforts.

Rotary is a 4-star rated charity, with 95% of funds directly supporting projects. District 3060 raised over \$1.1 million for Projects like cervical cancer Screening Centers, a mothers' milk bank, and adopting 80 villages for community development.

PP Rtn. Chandresh Makhija highlighted Rotary's flagship program, which partnered with 150+ governments to nearly eradicate Polio. Rotary's experience in fighting polio also helped combat COVID-19 by providing Oxygen, PPE kits, beds, and ventilators.

He urged every Rotarian to contribute to TRF, emphasizing it as the best platform to "pay back to society." District grants have supported projects like dialysis machines and school benches.

ROTARY: AN OCEAN OF OPPORTUNITIES

RPIC and Rotary Addiction Prevention Core Member PDG Pinkyben Patel took the stage after a warm introduction by PP Urmil Shah, highlighting her achievements for Vadodara, her club, district, and Rotary International. She emphasized Rotary's 119-year legacy as a top service organization, renowned for transparency and minimal admin costs, attracting major philanthropists like the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Smt. Rajshri Birla. She urged Rotarians to execute impactful projects and share their success widely. Pinkyben also offered practical guidance to the club and motivated members to pursue large projects using global and district grants, CSR funds, and donations.







WHAT ARE TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP IN ROTARY?

Active Membership (called Rotarians)
Honorary Membership (called Honorary Rotarians) Rotary International offers two types of Membership:

However, flexibility in active membership offers opportunities to invite individuals with diverse backgrounds and interests. I am pleased to share details of various types of Rotary membership in this episode of Rotary Information.

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP:

Active members are the backbone of Rotary clubs. They meet the requirements for membership, pay RI dues, are eligible to vote on club and district matters, are eligible to hold club offices and count in the club's membership numbers in Rotary's database. An active member can be Honorary member of other club(s).

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP:

Bestowed upon individuals who have distinguished themselves by meritorious service and embody Rotary ideals, or support Rotary's causes. They are exempt from paying RI dues, have no vote in Rotary matters & are not eligible to hold any club office. They are not included in a club's membership numbers in Rotary's database. They can attend regular meetings and participate in club projects.

CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP:

Corporate membership allows a company or organization to become a member of Rotary by paying dues. The organization designates an employee to participate in Rotary activities, attend meetings and represent the organization. In case of transfer or change in position, the company can designate another individual to Rotary Membership.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP:

Family memberships allows multiple family members to join the club as alternate members. Alternate members can be spouse and/or young adult children of the primary member. They are RI Dues paying active members. Clubs usually offer subsidized membership fee to them.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP:

This membership is a provisional or trial membership that allows prospective members to participate in club activities before committing to full membership. It's a way for individuals to explore what Rotary offers and determine if it's the right platform for them. They are reported as active members once they pay the RI

EMERITUS MEMBERSHIP:

Awarded to long term exemplary Rotarians of club who for various reasons can no longer actively participate in regular meetings & projects. This status is to be considered an honor for service & give the recipient the a continuous of belonging to the club. Emeritus member is a member of the club but not member of RI & does

ROTARACT-ROTARIAN MEMBERSHIP:

Rotaractors can join as Rotary Member. They pay all applicable dues for Rotary and Rotaract to retain their active membership in both clubs. Upon joining Rotary as active members, they become eligible for Global Grant Scholarship funds and Rotary Peace Fellowships.
