


+ FORTHCOMING MEETINGS +

- Ensure diverse representation: Include members from various professional, cultural, and demographic backgrounds.
- Promote inclusive leadership: Rotate the meeting roles to give different members the opportunity to lead.
- Consider the meeting environment: Choose accessible venues and consider the cost and people's dietary needs.
- Use technology to help: Offer hybrid meeting options and use features such as closed captions.
- Be culturally sensitive: Use inclusive language and acknowledge significant holidays and religious events.
- Offer ways for people to give feedback: Establish channels for members to share their thoughts and opinions.
- Provide education and training: Ask members to identify topics of interest and organize DEI workshops based on feedback.
- Engage with your community: Partner with local organizations focused on diversity and inclusion.
