Speaker's Session:

Through his brilliant data collection and graphs he showed that in 1000 AD India was 33% of world GDP. But after British invaded India in 1700 the graph had hit the bottom. He linked the past with the current scenario and gave hope that though the western world continues to dominate now with the tariff and trade wars, India will hold its ground. Though there are tough times ahead, India will hopefully maneuver it's way out as done in the past. After the enlightening presentation, he addressed with optimism the queries raised by PP Rtn. Jagdish Thakkar and PP. Rtn. Hemang Vahia.
















SECRETARIAL ANNOUNCEMENT


INVITATION
