ROTARY BOSH BRIDGE PROGRAM- FAQ'S

SERVICE REPORT FROM PP RTN. KIRIT DHOLAKIA

This is to introduce and inform the **Rotary-BOSH Bridge Program for all members of RCBJ.**

What is Bridge Program?

To impart the soft skills like spoken English, introductory course for the computer operation, public speaking etc by way of teaching to the backward area students with a minimum age of 18 years.

- 1) The program is for the students from backward areas of Gujarat State.
- 2) The tenure of the program for each batch is for two months.
- 3) The maximum number of students in a batch should be 25.
- 4) The dedicated instructor is selected by each Centre by taking interviews, training, and passing tests conducted by BOSH.
- 5) The duties of a trainer teacher are as follows.
 - Before starting the batch of students, he will visit the villages around the Centre.
 - Make aware of the prospective students for the feature of this program.
 - Instructure will enroll them by filling the forms printed by Centre's.
 - Once the minimum number of 10 and more students are ready to be enrolled, he must inform the management of the school and RCBJ for the starting date.

The criteria for the selecting Training Centre

1. Centre must have a separate teaching hall where they can accommodate a minimum 25 students.
2. Proper seating arrangement with benches and the white board.
3. Projector with a screen.
4. Separate tutor for teaching this course other than the school staff
5. Computer lab with sufficient computers.

Students must pay a token deposit for enrolling in the course, which is refunded after completion of the course and clearing of the examination taken by BOSH. This token deposit is retained by the Training Center.

The Rotary-BOSH Bridge Program was launched with 130 Students in Muni Seva Ashram, Goraj on August 12, 2024 at VTC Training Centre.

First Centre

- The Rotary Bosh Bridge Program's first Centre was launched at Nalanda Vidyalaya at Ghoghamba village in Panchmahal district. The program was launched on 23 September 2024 with 25 students in the first batch.
- On Oct 8, MSA and RCBJ members IPP Rtn. Umed Fifadra, PP Rtn. Manoj Adalja and my self (Kirit bhai) -visited Nalanda Vidyalaya to meet the students. We were extremely happy at the progress of the Bridge program at Nalanda Vidyalaya.
- **Six students from the first batch have received employment offers after completion of the 2 months course.**

Second Centre:

With the success of first Centre, we have launched second Centre at Don Bosco School, Kwant on 7th January 2025. There are 34 students enrolled for the course.

Since the second Centre is temporarily equipped with needed equipment and minimum arrangement, The Don Bosco School Centre needs following equipment.

- Minimum 20 Computers.
- 20 Student benches.
- 20 sets of translated books (In Gujarati) for their course.
- White Board.

Since our club is the promoter of this second Centre, I request all the RCBJ members to donate and support generously for the much-needed equipment.

Up till now we have already fulfilled all the requirements successfully with generous help of club members and the Centre has conducted 3 batches with approximately 125 students successfully. Fourth batch is under process and being enrolled.

This information is for all my fellow Rotarians of RCBJ and I would like to request all of you to participate in this program and support towards future development.
