Continuing its commitment to child health and preventive care, RCBC successfully organized its second free eye check-up camp for children of Gorwa Aanganwadi.

This time, the initiative extended its reach across three Aanganwadis, benefiting nearly 70 young children. Conducted in collaboration with a skilled medical team, the camp focused on early detection and basic treatment of vision-related issues.

The outcome: - 5–6 children were found to have minor eye infections and dry eyes and were promptly administered eye drops. Good news once again — no child required spectacles, indicating a healthy trend and reinforcing the value of early screening.

The camp was actively supported by Rtn. Shital Parikh, Rtn. Ami Shah, and Rtn. Vijay Vora, whose presence added encouragement and warmth to the initiative.

With each camp, RCBC takes a clear step forward — toward a healthier, brighter future for the children of our community.

Service above self — one kit, one smile, one life touched at a time.














HUMF


