
# Vyakti Vikas Course

The purpose of this program is to prepare students to think about "Entrepreneurship" upon completion of their studies.

It is well observed that only 10% to 15% of top students get a job from campuses & the balance 85% struggle to get a job.

We aim to empower 8th and 9th-grade students to think independently, innovate, and take initiative. This program run in batches of 30-40 students will foster a growth mindset, encouraging students to explore their passions and pursue their dreams. Through 35 sessions of practical guidance and mentorship, we hope to inspire the next generation of entrepreneurs and leaders. The total project cost is INR 7 Lakhs with no cost to the schools.

A dedicated member of the Rotary Club of Mumbai Kandivali West since 2003, he was among the club's youngest Rotarians. His active involvement in Rotary and Rotaract has benefited society and enriched his personal growth.

#### Early Life and Education



Born in Borivali West, Mumbai, in the early 1970s, Pankaj was an only child. His father, a dedicated railway employee, and his mother, a compassionate teacher, instilled strong values and a sense of purpose in him. Despite being introverted as a child, Pankaj excelled at St. Francis High School. His fascination with science led him to pursue a degree in Computer Science Engineering. A visit to BARC during his final year of engineering ignited a passion for perfection and inspired him to strive for excellence in all his endeavours. He further enhanced his academic qualifications with an MBA from NMIMS.

#### A Turning Point: The Rotaract Journey

While preparing for his MBA entrance exams, Pankaj joined the Rotaract Club of Dahisar Coast. This marked a pivotal moment in his life. The club provided him with a platform to develop his leadership skills, network with like-minded individuals, and contribute to meaningful community service projects. His active participation in RYLA programs and his dedication to Rotaract led to rapid advancement, culminating in the roles of ZRR and DRR within a few years.

Thanks to generous support from our members, we've been able to equip the Center with the necessary tools and resources, including robotic kits, laptops, and 3D printers. By partnering with Grok Learning, we've ensured that students receive high-quality, professional instruction.







#### CT Scan at Hitwardak

The report of the CT Scan machine installed in Hitwardak Charitable Trust Hospital


