





Education – East vs West


- Mrs. Mrinalini Sadananda was the excellent speaker.



SHE CHALLENGED SOCIAL STIGMA

Activist Padma Venkatraman has transformed the lives of the leprosy afflicted, investing them with dignity and sufficiency

t's not just the physical scarring that causes anguish for those affected by leprosy. Shunned by families, and emotionally broken, many formed colonies on the outskirts of a city and lived by their own rules. No one - from sanitary inspectors to the police — dared to enter. Padma Venkatraman, who was on a visit from Vienna, found one of them begging on the roads and followed him into a colony in RK Puram. She then made it her life's mission to improve the quality of life of those afflicted with the disease.

"I met Anna Hazare to understand how I could rehabilitate Shahdara, one of Asia's largest leprosy colonies. From drug peddling to utter poverty there were multiple issues; it would be impossible to solve them, he told me. Undeterred, I wanted to usher in economic independence for all. I suggested business plans to several colonies and they told me no one would buy their products. I got a few enrolled in detergent making classes in a government institution because I knew no one would consume the eatables made by them. The products sold out and for the first time, they didn't have to beg for a living," says Padma, whose efforts were considered a model that could be replicated in several countries by the United Nations FAO. Her initiative has also been a case study for several Ivy League institutions.

Apart from building schools and homes, she wanted to help with micro credit loans.

Families from colonies with rickshaws and motorised vehicle unloader purchased with the loans tailored specifically for those living in India's leprosy colonies. "I formed welfare committees in India at each of the colonies and allotted loans with funds from the UN. The amount would be returned, rotated and used by others. It worked wonderfully in Delhi, and in no time, the affected colonies in Tamil Nadu had a shining example. Being

deemed social outcasts, they now had an

identity of their own. A tiny loan changed

their lives," says Padma, The elder daughter of former President of India, R. Venkataraman, Padma considers her father an important influence. "Labour leaders would come and visit my father regularly and I wanted to be like him, helping everyone. I wanted to be a doctor, but my grandmother wanted me to get married. I lived in Vienna, but I would regularly visit India to follow up on the progress of the colonies. They had my number and would call me to fill in the details. They nicknamed

me 'Amma'," says Padma.
Padma, who has been felicitated with several awards, including the Malala Award for best supporter of the differently abled and

the Hand of Hope from Hope World Wide and most recently the Vocational Services Award by the Rotary Club of Adyar 3230, wants to see many myths about leprosy broken. "People with leprosy have built houses, have bank accounts, but the stigma remains. Many ask me how I can work with people affected with leprosy. We must change the myth about it being contagious. Now, there are advanced drug therapies and support systems in place to combat the disease," she concludes.














SPONSOR OF EDUCATION


- Request to sponsor the education for two girl children in our adopted village had come through our Community Services Director & accordingly our following members contributed.
